Welcome

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Welcome to Kestrels class! We are excited to welcome the children back for their first term in Year 6! It is sure to be a fun-filled and busy term.

Reading

This term we have chosen 'The Railway Children' by Edith Nesbit as our reading for pleasure text. We will be reading this text whenever we get a free minute during class – it's sure to be a wonderful read.

Our writing lessons will give us the opportunity to read 'Beowulf' by Michael Morpurgo and 'Macbeth - A Shakespeare Story' by Andrew Matthews & Tony Ross.

Writing

This term we will be beginning the term using a short film clip called 'The Piano'. This unit will give us the opportunity to write a character description, a flashback and a letter.

Following this, we will use the story of 'Macbeth' to support us to write a balanced argument and a newspaper report.

Towards the end of term, we will read 'Beowulf' and write newspapers and kennings.

ous year groups

We will also use this term to embed key grammar and punctuation skills from previous year groups.

Maths

This terms units will include:

- Place Value
- Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division

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We will also be ensuring children are up to speed with their times tables knowledge as this will support their arithmetic skills throughout the year and link to the all the other areas of maths which will follow our Autumn 1 units.



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During our Science lessons this term, the children will be classifying living things. They will be learning about the work or Carl Linnaeus, learning how to describe and classify animals, plants and micro-organisms.



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Computing

In computing this term, the children will be learning the basic principles of creating and maintaining a blog in a controlled and safe environment. They will also learn about history of the internet.



DT

This term in DT we will be designing and creating a new school playground. The children use a variety of materials to create their playground, as well as learning how to safely use saw to cut dowel and jelutong.



History

In history this term, the children will be learning about the census. They will learn to identify the type of information the census gives about people. They will then use the census to make inferences about people from the past, providing supporting evidence for their statements. Observations from the census will further support them to identify changes between periods of time.



Music

The focus this term in music is 'Happy' by Pharrell Williams. The children will be using their knowledge of rhythm, tempo and pulse to learn and perform their version of the song.



<u> PE</u>

PE days this term will be Mondays and Wednesdays. Children are reminded that they should come to school wearing their school PE kits on these days. On a Monday, children will be taking part in gymnastics in the hall and on a Wednesday, the children will be taking part in fitness outside.

PSHE

In PSHE this term the children will be recapping 'The Zones of Regulation'.



They will be using the zones throughout the year to identify their physical and emotional feelings, as well as techniques for supporting them to overcome difficult and new situations.

RE

In RE, the focus will be on Hinduism. The children will learn all about India and their culture They will then go on to learn all about Hindu deities, Mandirs and how Hindu's worship.
