



Year 6 Eagles Newsletter - Spring 1

Welcome

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Happy New Year and welcome back! We hope you had a lovely Christmas. We are looking forward to a fun half term full of learning.

Reading

This term Eagles have voted to read 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas' as our reading for pleasure text. We will be reading this twice a week for enjoyment and it links nicely with our History topic this half term- World War 2.



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During other class reading lessons, we will continue to develop children's retrieval, inference and summarising skills with comprehension and skills lessons.



Writing

We will be beginning this term using the book 'A series of Unfortunate Events' by Lemony Snicket. This unit will give us the opportunity to write a character description, a setting description, a diary and a narrative in the style of Lemony Snicket.



Following this, we will use the short film 'Dracula' to support us in developing our writing by using a range of year 6 skills.

Towards the end of term, we will read 'Goodnight Mr Tom' and learn to write a political public address.



In grammar lessons, we will teach the children how to use and identify synonyms and antonyms, hyphens and bullet points to develop their writing even further.

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Maths

This terms units will include:

- Ratio
- Algebra
- Area, perimeter and volume



The children will build upon the knowledge they gained during the Autumn term in order to develop their understanding of these topics and will continue to consolidate their arithmetic understanding.



Science

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During our science lessons this term, we will be learning about evolution and inheritance. Children will explain why there are differences within a species, recognise the inheritance of characteristics in plants and animals and explain why adaptation is necessary. They will model how natural selection affects population size. Additionally, the children will describe the theory of evolution and recognise evidence that can be used for this.

Computing

In computing this term, the children will be learning all about spreadsheets. By the end of this unit, the children will have learnt how to use a spreadsheet to investigate probability, to calculate the discount and final prices in a sale and plan a school charity day to maximise the money donated to charity.

Art

Our art unit is 'Drawing: Make my voice heard'. During this topic the children will explore expressive drawing techniques, consider how symbolism in art can convey meaning and apply an understanding of the drawing technique 'chiaroscuro' to create a powerful image.

History

This half term we will be learning all about World War 2 during history lessons. We will begin by learning about the causes of World War 2. We will then move on to learn about The Battle of Britain, The Blitz and what life was like for evacuated children during the war. We will finish our half term by considering the impact WW2 had on women's lives.



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Music

This term, children will learn A New Year carol by Benjamin Britten, as well as other songs by this artist. During the unit, they will build upon the knowledge they have gained so far during Year 6, considering pulse, rhythm, dynamics, tempo and pitch.



PΕ

PE days this term will be Wednesdays and Fridays. Children are reminded that they should come to school wearing their school PE kits on these days. On a Wednesday, children will be taking part in basketball outside and on a Friday, the children will be taking part in dance in the hall.



PSHE

In PSHE this term the children will be learning about stealing and worrying. We will be discussing strategies to support us when we are worried.



RE

In RE, we will be starting a new unit 'Beliefs and Actions in The World: Can Christian Aid and Islamic Relief change the world?'. We will start the unit by looking at different charities. The children will then move on to compare Christian Aid and Islamic Relief charities. They will end this half term by exploring justice and fairness.





Homework

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This half term the children will continue receive weekly homework. This will include a maths, reading and grammar activity each week. They also have 10 weekly spellings to learn, and the children would benefit from reading at home as often as possible.
