## Welcome

New routines will be established this term and we look forward to getting to know all parents, carers and children.

## Phonics

Phonics

Early phonic sessions will take place next term. This term we will be playing various listening games to enhance listening skills and concentration

## Literacy

This term we will be listening to nursery rhymes and stories and begin to look at, read and share books together both in small groups and as a class. We will be encouraging the children to recognise some familiar story characters along the way.

Sounds within our own environment will also be of focus.



## Maths

In Maths we will be singing and taking part in Number songs to 5, exploring the concept and small and subitising amounts to 3.



## Communication and language

We will encourage the children to listen and make comments about their learning. The children will also be encouraged to express their ideas and feelings using full understandable sentences, where and if possible.



### Personal, social and emotional development



We will continue to support the children to make positive relationships and help them to settle into new Nursery routines with both their peers and the adults in Bumblebee class. The children will continue to develop an understanding of the school rules as well as the class rules. We will continue to encourage independence.

### Physical development

We will continue to provide activities to further develop the children's fine motor skills which in turn will help with their letter formation later on in the year.



### Understanding the world

We will begin by exploring who is in our family and talk about them. Our topic will then progress to observe changes that occur in Autumn, the natural world and the discussions around these.



### Helping your child learn at home



Please continue to support your child to be independent, putting on and taking off their coats and shoes.

Support your child with their reading by sharing stories and exposing them to a variety of books.

Encourage correct letter formation, especially the letters within their names.

Support your children to recognise, sort and count numbers confidently 0-5, 0-10.
