Children will be reassessed in the coming weeks so may start to bring home more difficult by Please try to find time to read with them at least 3 times a week. In class, we will continue to have 4 reading sessions a week which will focus on a mixture of phonics, fluency and comprehension.

Please ensure children have their book bags in school every day so that we can easily check and change books.

Writing

Over the next few weeks we will be reading several versions of Goldilocks and then writing our own sequel to the story. Later in the term, we will be finding out how to be good pet owners and will write instructions to help others. We will continue to focus on punctuation and using conjunctions to extend our sentences.



Maths

This terms units will include:

Multiplication and Division: Children will be consolidating knowledge of multiplication and division. They will be focusing on multiplying and dividing by 2, 5 and 10 and solving word problems alongside their fluency skills.

Length and Height: Children will be learning how to measure in metres and centimetres. They will compare and order different heights and lengths using inequality symbols (< > =).

Mass, Capacity and Temperature: Children will be looking at measuring mass in kilograms and grams. They will also use millilitres and litres to measure liquids. Children will be able to choose the most appropriate measure to use.

Science

The children will be continuing to learn about animals including humans. We will learn



More about life cycles and what we need to stay healthy.



Computing

In computing this term the children will be learning to code. Children will use the programme Purple Mash to write code and debug algorithms they have made.
