Welcome to our Spring 2 newsletter! This half term is extremely exciting with lots of interesting topics. Below is a summary of what we will be covering in Year 5 this half term.

Reading

*World Book Day: Thursday March 2nd



This term we will continue to have 3 whole class reading sessions each week, exploring a number of texts and genres. In particular, the children will be looking at extracts such as Utterly Dark and the Face of The Deep by Philip Reeve and The Raven Heir by Stephanie Burgis and Fish in a Tree by Lynda Mullaly-Hunt amongst many more!

We will begin our new class novel 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell.

Writing

This term we will be focusing on writing an adventure story. Linked with our class novel, 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell, the children will have an experience day to become familar the Amazon rainforest to collect subject rich language. They will then explore writing skills such as personification, metaphors and complex sentences through a series of guided and independent lessons.



Weekly spellings will be posted to Spelling Frame and a copy given for children to stick into their reading journal.

Maths

This terms units will include:

- Decimals and Percentages
- Perimeter and Area



Fractions
Statistics

We will also continue to have arithmetic lessons to recap our knowledge of methods to add, subtract, multiply and divide effectively.

Science

The focus for this half term will be 'Earth and Space'. Children will begin by exploring what the solar system is, the planets, and find out some fascinating facts about them. They will find out how the Earth, Moon and other planets move in relation to the Sun in the solar system.



Computing

In computing this term, the children will be learning to use 'Spreadsheets'. They will begin to use formulae to convert measures, calculate perimeter and area and to model a real-life problem.



Art and design

This term in art, children will be developing their drawing and printing skills. We will discuss retrofuturism and Teis Albers' piece 'Moonwalk'.



Geography

In our geography unit "Why do oceans matter?", we will learn about how the ocean is used for human activity and explain how the ocean helps to regulate the Earth's climate and temperature. We will learn about the location and the benefits of the Great Barrier Reef and discuss how we can support healthy oceans.



Music

There is no music teaching in this half term.



Spanish

In our unit 'La Familia', children will learn to discuss their family members in Spanish.



PE

PE days this term will continue to be Tuesday and Wednesday.

On Tuesday, we will begin 'Tennis'. Children will learn the forehand, backhand and learn to play a continuous rally.

On Wednesday, we will be continuing swimming lessons at Corby Pool.

Don't forget your swimwear, towel and to remove jewellery.

Please remember to send your children in wearing the school PE kit on these days. Black hoodie and black trousers/joggers can be worn on top of the school PE kit. No bright colours, please!



PSHE

In PSHE this term the children will be learning about 'image sharing'.



Children will be able to list the reasons for sharing images online, describe the positive and negative consequences of image sharing and recognise the possible influences and pressures of image sharing.

In RE the children will continue their learning about Sikhism. We will focus on the 10 Gurus, the Gurdwara, the Amrit Ceremony and different Sikh festivals.
